Ranallo completed his Master's Degree at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland studying under Professor Allan Neave and Matthew McAllister, and his Bachelor of Music at Oberlin Conservatory under Stephen Aron. He is currently on faculty at the <a href="MNicc Suzuki">MNicc Suzuki</a> program and maintains a private teaching studio in Toronto.
